Wherever you decide to bring your group together, in person or virtually, here are five easy steps that take you from start to finish. You can also find more guidance on hosting a House Meeting in our toolkit – use the QR code to access all our useful links.

Welcome the group, allow everyone to introduce themselves and spend a few minutes sharing what inspired you to host or attend this House Meeting.

2 Introduce EmpowerED Birmingham. Give everyone time to read about the coalition and the three focus areas: Community Power, Access to Information, and Stronger Community Partnerships.

> TIP: Hand out the 'We are EmpowerEd Birmingham' pamphlet or share the website link so people can look on their phones.

Ask the guiding questions for the three focus areas (these can be found in the 'Share with us' sections of the pamphlet). Remember to take notes and share your reflections on the House Meeting with us. You can find the link in the QR code.

TIP: You can assign someone to take notes for you, or try recording the meeting on your phone and then listen back later and make notes. Ask everyone to fill out the reflection survey before they leave so we can record their contributions (follow the link in the QR code). Ask anyone who is interested in joining the movement to make a personal commitment when they fill it out and to visit the website for more information on how to get involved, host a House Meeting, or join a Blueprint Design Team.
